Principal's Corner

With ASCS Principal, Steve Zangl

At ASCS, we purchase a subscription to *Growing in Faith*, a monthly newsletter for families. Over the next three weeks, I would like to share the text and idea from this subscription on Lenten prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Prayer

"... When you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you" (Matthew 6: 5-6)

Conversational prayer. All relationships need nurturing — even our relationship with God. It is in prayer that we can confide our deepest desires, hurts, needs. It is in prayer that we discern God's voice. Especially during Lent, make time every day to talk to God and grow in love with him. Remember, he finds everything about you interesting.

Community prayer. *"For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them"* (Matthew 18:20). Praying in a group not only brings God into your circle, it also makes members aware of the needs and concerns of others who may be outside the circle.

The Stations of the Cross. Walking the Stations of the Cross is a powerful way to pray during Lent. Fr. Max says the Stations for our students each Friday at 2:15 at St. Michael's Oratory and again at 7:00 PM in church. You could also walk the Stations yourself at church to reflect on Jesus' journey from judgment to burial.

Private Eucharistic prayer. Praying before the Eucharist is one of the most sacred places to pray. Consider arriving for Mass early to spend extra time in prayer before the tabernacle.
